Presentations

Mary provided attendees with information on the services provided through the Children's Developmental Services Agency. She shared a PowerPoint that will be shared with attendees. Some basic information. CDSA is part of the NC Infant-Toddler program providing early intervention services for children from birth until the third birthday. Children with developmental disabilities and/or delays are entitled to EI services under IDEA, Part C. No financial requirement. Anyone can make a referral.

Barbara provided the group with information on NC PreK. The application is in the process of being translated to Spanish as soon as it is ready will be up on the website. Free program to qualified children in all counties. It is a 6.5 or more hour per day program, 5 days a week through 10 months. Gets the children ready for kindergarten. A family needs to go to the provider where they would like to enroll the child and complete the NC PreK application and enrollment paperwork. Need a birth certificate and a way to verify income such as a W2, tax return, or pay stubs. If receiving any type of pubic assistance, complete page 5 and no other income verification is needed. There are other ways to qualify if over income such as the child having an IEP, homeless, medical condition, or military family. Besides being income eligible, the child needs to be 4 by 8/31 of the year. Sites have their own requirements in which the lead teacher needs to have a bachelors degree in Birth through K, be a 4 or 5 star site, a 5.0 or higher on the ECERS, and use an approved curriculum.
